As retirees, my husband and I do not wish the imputation tax system abolished, as it is rumoured to be.

We worked very hard during our lives, often at 2 or 3 jobs, at a time, very rarely having restaurant meals or going on holidays, saving rather than spending, so that we could be independant when we retired. At present, because of the downturn in the the economy, we are now eligible for a Commonwealth Seniors Health Card, as the value of our superannuation and shares has fallen by more than a half. If the present imputation system was abolished, we would be forced to go on the pension, loose our independence and become a drain on the economy.
