

Thank you for the opportunity to make a submission to the review .
Please consider the following:

- * Review the current arrangements for superannuation contributions which provide a tax minimisation avenue for the rich

- * Alcoholic drinks should be taxed according to the volume of alcohol present.

- * Break the present link between property valuation and water rates. Have a progressive property tax on wealthy residents, but charge for water by volume at a progressive rate (more per litre for high users).

- * International implementation of the Currency Transaction Development Levy (CTDL) would tax the trade in foreign exchange, would return \$3,200 billion daily, would stabilise currency movements and fund projects social security, universal health care and education.

- * Reverse the trend to lower corporate and personal income taxes, a trend that has benefited the rich at the expense of the poor over the past decade.

- * The GST is regressive in effect and the rate should be reduced and the income raised from progressive personal income tax

- * The GST should not apply to books

- * I note that the German Government has decided to revamp its motor vehicle tax so that in future the rate depends on the amount of carbon emitted from exhausts. I strongly urge the the taxation review to recommend the Australian Government negotiate a similar arrangement with the States.

- * The Australian Government should do everything in its power to stop wealthy Australians and multinational companies from using tax havens to avoid their responsibilities.
